COVID-19 Emergency Response Plan

Summary

The Door County Maritime Museum (DCMM) continues to monitor the COVID-19 situation. Our priorities are to keep our employees and guests safe.

Keeping in mind that the COVID19 situation is very dynamic, we are prepared to adapt to any changing circumstances.

DCMM will follow, and update guidelines based on existing and future Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidance.

Prevention is key when any virus is potentially present, including COVID-19.

DCMM will endeavor to safeguard our staff and guests with policies that meet, or exceed State guidance.

We ask that you take your own health, and that of others, seriously.

Our DCMM team will endeavor to protect against coronavirus by continuing to monitor the developments, and adjust these policies and admissions as the situation demands.

Guest Expectations

The Door County Maritime Museum (DCMM) takes your health and safety seriously. Keeping in mind that the COVID19 situation is very dynamic, we are continuing to monitor guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). Also, know that we are prepared to adapt to any and all changing circumstances as needed. DCMM will follow – and update – our guidelines based on ongoing CDC guidance.

Prevention is key when any virus is potentially present, including COVID-19.

We ask that our guests, volunteers, and staff help us in the following ways:

- **Take your own health, and that of others, seriously.**
- **Act honestly, and with caution, on your assessment of your own health.**
- **Wear a mask in shared public spaces where social distancing is not constantly in place.**
- **Wash, or sanitize your hands at least two or three times while visiting the Museum.**
- **If you believe you may be ill, do not visit the Museum! We urge you to self-isolate.**
- **Be aware the museum may limit the number of guests in the building at any given time depending on the public health guidelines in place at that time.**

Know that the DCMM staff has an internal set of COVID-19 policies and procedures that is based on CDC guidance. The Museum will update this as the situation changes.

Please check our social media platforms for updates regarding events in the coming weeks and months as these may change.

Our guests should know these points:

1. We constantly monitor and will limit the number of guests we allow into any museum managed property so that social distance standards can be easily met.
This guideline is in place to maintain and maximize social distancing opportunities between our guests, as the situation merits. The museum will follow guidance from the WI Health Department and the Centers for Disease Control.
2. GUESTS MUST KEEP SOCIALY DISTANT WHILE VISITING THE MUSEUM.
3. Surfaces around the Museum will be cleaned multiple times during the day. Please allow our staff the space to clean if they are in the gallery with you.
4. Signage reminding guests to use protective measures and wash their hands are placed throughout the Museum.
5. Various “touch spots” around the museum will be marked so that guests may be aware of these, and staff can disinfect them.
6. Gallery doors in Sturgeon Bay will be left OPEN when the Museum is open so guests do not have to pull or push doors open. (Staff must secure all doors when closing the museum).
7. Guests may be asked to place their credit/debit card in – and remove it from – the reader so that no staff member touches your card.
8. If you see something that is a potential hazard, please let the front desk staff person know immediately.
